FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR & INTERIM CEO



USRowing's 2025 was defined by cultivating momentum - not only in successes on the water, but through development within and across every level of our organization. We strengthened our feedback mechanisms, creating more opportunities to **gain valuable input from our members** and **ensure their voices shape the future of our sport**. As the first year in a home-games Olympic and Paralympic cycle, we **invested in our athletes, members, clubs, and communities** and laid the foundation for sustainable success. Our tenets of **Performance, Experience, and Community** ground our organization's efforts in the journey **toward the LA28 Games and beyond**.

PERFORMANCE: The 2025 season demonstrated the strength and depth of the U.S. High Performance system. Across the U19, U23, Senior, Para, and Coastal programs, **U.S. athletes earned 19 international medals, including eight World Championship golds**, proving that the strategic direction of High Performance is yielding podium-level results at every level. We were proud to see new **historic victories, including the first-ever U.S. World Championship title in the U23 Men's Four**, as well as the continued legacy of success in Beach Sprints – medaling at every World Finals since the discipline's introduction in 2019. Beyond international competition, we **expanded athlete development** through Pathways programming, increased Para and Coastal rowing opportunities, and committed to developing training centers, including the **groundbreaking of the Caspersen expansion project**—investments that will strengthen our High Performance system as we build towards LA28 and Brisbane 2032.

EXPERIENCE: Delivering exceptional experiences for our members remains central to everything we do. In 2025, USRowing hosted some of the **largest and most successful events in our history** while introducing innovative **new competition opportunities**. **RowFest National Championships** was honored as the **Best New Sports Event by SportsTravel magazine**, and the inaugural **International Rowing Challenge** welcomed 108 athletes from four countries for a new U19 high-performance competition. Our **Youth National Championships** continued to grow, welcoming more than 11,000 athletes, coaches, families, and supporters daily. We also strengthened engagement with our referee community through nationwide listening sessions, as well as enhanced event safety, education, and Safe Sport initiatives. **These efforts culminated in the safest competition year in the 2022-2025 period**.



COMMUNITY: Building a stronger, more connected rowing community remained a priority throughout the year, seen in **matching record highs of average annual membership of over 77,000** and **hosting the most sanctioned head race, coastal, and indoor regattas in the organization's history**. We launched **Voices in Rowing** to create an ongoing dialogue with our members while continuing to expand learning and leadership opportunities across the sport. **The Launch surpassed 3,700 courses** completed in the calendar year, and we awarded more than **\$200,000 in athlete scholarships** along with **\$80,000 in United We Row grants** benefiting 16 organizations. We were honored to receive the **United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee's NGB Choice Award** for the United We Row Grants Program for the second consecutive time, recognizing its national impact in advancing inclusion and expanding access to rowing.

OPERATING PERFORMANCE: Behind every successful season is a strong and sustainable organization. In 2025, USRowing **achieved its third consecutive operating surplus**, finishing the year with a **\$968,000 surplus**—the strongest operating performance since 2015. We also achieved another **record year of philanthropy** by reaching over **\$8M in contributions**, while securing additional gifts towards the Caspersen Boathouse expansion, multi-year naming rights, and seed gifts for two endowments. 2025 efforts have reinforced our ability to serve members in the present while positioning USRowing to **remain financially resilient**, operationally sound, and fiscally prepared for the future. In part, we do rely on supporters and donors to expand these capabilities, and this will become even more important as we grow into this future.

As we look to the future, we do so with a discerning lens. There are challenges, and we intend to transform them into opportunities that strengthen the sport, re-envision the value we offer to members, and deliver podium-level performances in international competition.

To our athletes, coaches, referees, regatta directors, volunteers, donors, partners, clubs, and members: **we value your voices, and thank you for your unwavering commitment to rowing and for the role each of you plays in helping our community thrive.**

The momentum we've built together is only the beginning, and we look forward to continuing that progress alongside our entire rowing community.

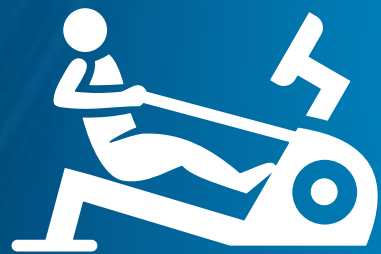

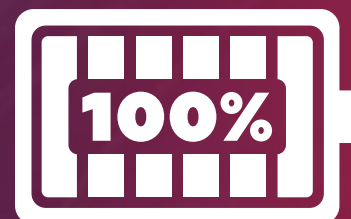

HIGH PERFORMANCE

The 2025 season showcased **strong performances across every level** of the High Performance system, highlighted by **eight World Championship gold medals**, multiple podium finishes in all disciplines, and historic results in numerous events. Beyond international success, the organization **strengthened** the High Performance pipeline through **expanded athlete development** and talent identification in Pathways programs, enhanced Para training and competition opportunities, launched a senior domestic beach sprint camp, and continued investment in training center infrastructure.



SENIOR TEAM

World Championship gold for the W4- and the LW1x.

World Championship bronze for the M8+, the first back-to-back medals in this event since 2006, and the W2- also earned bronze - their first medal in this event since 2022.

Best World Championships finish in the M4x since 1998, with a fourth-place finish.

Groundbreaking on the Caspersen Rowing Center expansion project – a state-of-the-art training facility for athletes in New Jersey.



CASPERSEN TRAINING CENTER

A multi-million dollar expansion and renovation project marks a new era for U.S. National Team training.

The Caspersen Boathouse will be a state-of-the-art training facility designed to elevate athlete performance and experience as they pursue excellence in international competition.

Additions to the boathouse will include a weight room, an athlete lounge, and a multipurpose erg and event space.

The expansion will also support the growth and training needs of local rowing programs, including public programs for students in grades 7-12.



PARA TEAM



Won silver at World Cup II in the PR3 Mixed 4+.

Fourth-place finish for the PR3 Mixed 4+ at the 2025 World Rowing Championships – maintaining a continued top-five finish for the boat class since 2016.

Centralized coaching, athlete support services, and on-water access with on-land training by relocating the Boston Training Center.

Leveraged the San Diego Crew Classic and Canadian Henley as additional competitive racing opportunities for Para Development Camp participants – with first- or second-place finishes in the PR2 W1x Dash, PR3 Mixed 2x, and PR3 Mixed 2x Dash events at Canadian Henley.

BEACH SPRINT TEAM

Two golds and a silver at the 2025 World Rowing Beach Sprint Finals; the Coastal Mixed 4x+ took gold alongside Chris Bak, who won his third World Championship title. Bak then doubled in the Coastal Mixed 2x with Sera Busse to earn silver.

Chris Bak became the most decorated rower in Beach Sprints history.

U.S. maintained its status as a leading nation at World Rowing Beach Sprint Finals, with top-two performance in total medal count, and had the best performance of any nation in Olympic-class events.

Ran the first Senior domestic beach sprint camp for World Beach Sprint Trials preparation. All Senior winners at the trials participated in the camp.



PATHWAYS



Two gold medals (U19 W4-, U23 M4-) and two silver medals (U19 W8+, U23 W8+) in Olympic events, along with A-Final finishes in small boats (U23 LM1x silver and U19 M1x fifth place) further demonstrated our ability to be competitive in small boat events.

Saw significant increases in applications across U19 and U23 camps, including a 150% increase in U23 HP Winter Camp applications – reflecting expanding interest in the national team pathway.

Expanded development opportunities and identification efforts, adding the World University Championships and sculling development camps to the 2026 Pathways camp slate, as well as integrating six new U23 athletes into Para Pathway events.

Strengthened connections with the collegiate rowing community by holding 200+ calls with collegiate athletes and coaches from August 2025 to May 2026, including follow-up calls with all 68 athletes who attended the December Winter HP Camp.

EXPERIENCE

In 2025, USRowing delivered a **record-setting** year in member experience, hosting some of its **largest-ever regattas** while also developing highly successful and innovative new racing experiences, all while maintaining high satisfaction ratings across championships and development programs. Operational excellence was strengthened through **expanding referee support** and engagement, launching new international athlete development opportunities, and achieving the **safest year on record** for the 2022–2025 period by enhancing event safety protocols, modernizing safety education, and advancing SafeSport policies and athlete protection initiatives.



COMPETITION

Earned the Best New Sports Event award from *SportsTravel* magazine for RowFest National Championships; recognized for blending elite competition, athlete development, and community celebration.

Delivered the largest Youth National Championships to date, welcoming more than 11k spectators, athletes, coaches, and supporters per day.

Increased to a 4.3/5 average 5-star score from athletes and coaches at national championship regattas.

Hosted one of the largest summer championships in recent USRowing history at RowFest National Championships, delivering 2,600+ entries across eight days of racing and successfully serving youth, U23, and masters athletes.

Improved referee staffing levels at national championships to better support wellness, workload management, and high-quality officiating throughout multi-day events.



PROGRAMS



Maintained an average participant satisfaction rating of over 4/5 across all camps.

All 2025 USRowing Development camps were filled to capacity, reflecting continued demand for high-performance development opportunities across the Pathway.

Successfully launched the inaugural International Rowing Challenge (IRC), hosting 108 athletes from four countries in an international high-performance racing environment for emerging elite U19 athletes.



REFEREES



Successfully maintained a strong and engaged referee corps of approximately 400 officials nationwide, ensuring continued support for regattas and championship events across the country.

Surveyed the referee corps to identify key priorities, gather critical feedback, and help shape the future direction, planning, and strategic decision-making for officiating within USRowing.

Improved the referee travel experience with single-occupancy hotel rooms for referees working at USRowing Regional Championship events.

Increased operational efficiency at the Referee Committee level by improving prioritization, meeting effectiveness, and overall alignment on key initiatives and deliverables.

Conducted a nationwide referee listening tour, including regional meetings and one-on-one conversations with referee leadership, to better understand opportunities for improvement across the referee corps and to strengthen communication pathways.



SAFEGUARDING



2025 was USRowing's safest year in the 2022–2025 period, with zero member fatalities while rowing and fewer serious incident claims.

Heightened our standard of care at owned events through new Heat Safety Guidelines, including the deployment of additional hydration stations, standardizing heat-risk communications to all participants, and reinforcing on-site medical oversight.

Modernized safety education by releasing updated Safety Videos and new practical resources, including *Steering from the Bow* to help rowers navigate and equip themselves for safety.

Safe Sport efforts strengthened athlete protection through 145 case responses in 2025, as well as abuse prevention and response education delivered to 15k+ individuals.

Advanced accountability and compliance by helping shape the 2026 SafeSport Code, earning a fully compliant event audit, and implementing a stand-alone background check policy.

COMMUNITY

USRowing focused on **strengthening** community engagement, inclusion, and learning opportunities in 2025, **expanding leadership and mentorship programs**, and continuing major event programming that **highlighted diverse voices** and participation. We maintained strong membership and **growing participation** in coaching education and hosted regattas, while **increasing support** for athletes and programs through scholarships, grants, and financial assistance. Overall, these efforts supported broader access to rowing and **reinforced growth** across all levels of the community.



CULTIVATING COMMUNITY

Initiated Voices in Rowing as a platform to allow members to share what's most important, what's working, and what needs to improve.

Launched Scholastic, Administrator, Masters, and Regatta Director Leadership Groups as part of Voices in Rowing. Over 25 community members were selected to represent the diverse voices of our membership.

Held the third annual Toast in the Tower event at Youth Nationals, welcoming over 50 returning student-athletes and families—some attending for the third time—to celebrate community members of color.

Continued programming at Head of the Charles Regatta with over 200 participants, including a United We Row panel on inclusion, a celebration with the Survivor's Rowing Network, and a discussion led by Arshay Cooper of the A Most Beautiful Thing Inclusion Fund.

Led Para-athlete classification events at four separate regattas – USRowing Youth Nationals, Head Of The Charles, Head Of The Hooch, and BAYADA.



MEMBERSHIP

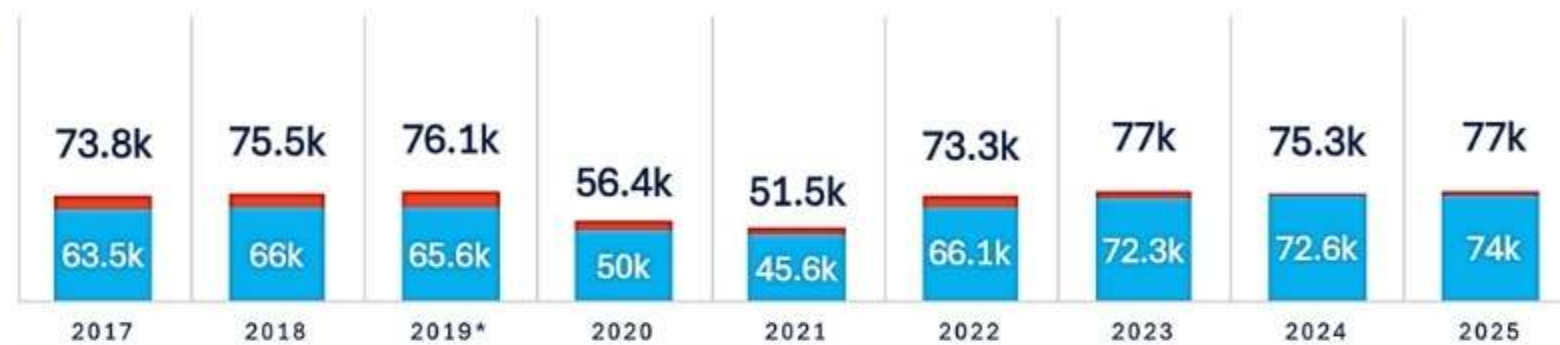
Tied the previous record of the highest average number of individual members at 77k, and hit a record of 74k average paid members.

Matched the second-highest year in total number of regattas, with record highs in head race and coastal events as well as the highest number of indoor events since 2020, showing increased growth and variety in the sport's regatta profile.

Expanded membership tiering through the Learn To Row membership option, creating a more accessible and affordable entry point into rowing by helping lower barriers for individuals interested in trying the sport and giving clubs a flexible way to welcome and engage new participants safely.

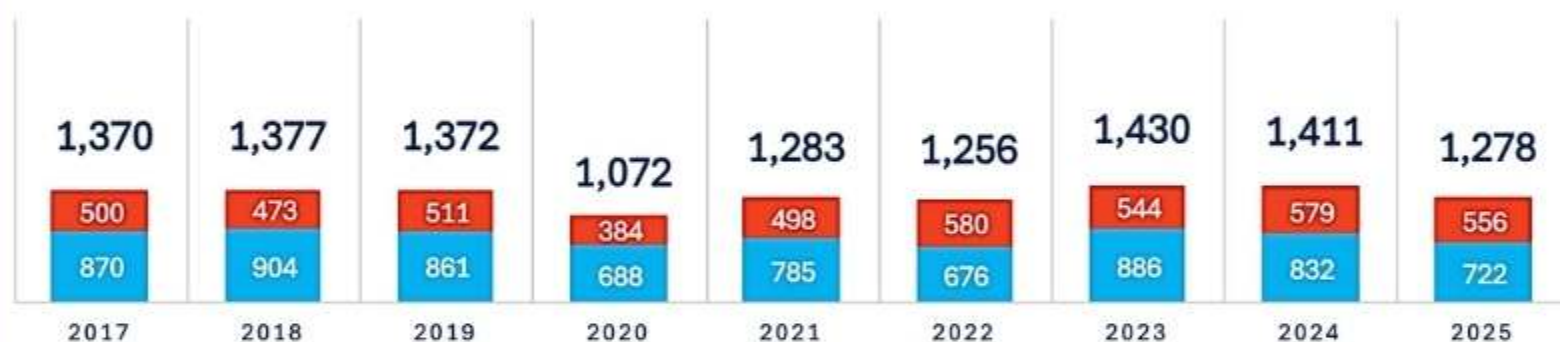
AVERAGE MONTHLY INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS, 2017-2025

LEARNING & DEVELOPMENT

Administered 5,700 hours of learning for the rowing community on USRowing's learning platform *The Launch*, with over 3,700 total courses completed.

Registered 2,100 new coaches across Level 1-3 certification programs.

Expanded United We Row Mentorship Programs for coaches from three to 17 pairs.

Sponsored the Steenstra Rowing Conference, where we conducted a Coastal Rowing 101 session and offered five scholarships to attendees for the event.

Sponsored five coaches' attendance at the 2025 Women's Coaches Conference.



UNITED WE ROW



Gifted over \$200k in scholarships, supporting 94 athletes to attend USRowing camps and 10 coaches to access professional development opportunities.

Awarded \$80k in grants to 16 organizations, supporting 400+ athletes nationwide.

Launched the Youth Power 20 Fund and the Carol and Jack Bialas Cool Runnings Fund, totaling \$760k in endowments to support emerging rowing programs and expand access to the sport, respectively.

Reduced financial barriers for athletes and families to participate by providing \$60k in membership support and waived regatta entry fees.

Congregated nearly 200 rowing leaders and community members attended the United We Row Summit, with 92.5% rating speaker quality highly.

OPERATING PERFORMANCE

USRowing achieved **record revenue results** in 2025, significantly increasing contributions, securing additional multi-year gifts, and **endowment support** that strengthened long-term financial stability and infrastructure investment. In addition to another year of strong financial operating performance, internally, we **expanded** the organization's leadership and staff capacity as well as **improved operations** through standardized compliance processes, cost efficiencies, and new technology tools.



DEVELOPMENT



Exceeded previous records, bringing in \$8.9M from contributions, grants, and partnerships.

Secured additional gifts towards the Caspersen Boathouse expansion project, multi-year naming rights, and seed gifts for two new endowments.

Established the Golden.Oar Society for planned giving.

Ended 2025 with 48 USRowing Foundation trustees, adding 13 new members.

PEOPLE, PROCESSES, & TECHNOLOGY

Added six additional full-time employees to support USRowing operations, competition, and high performance athlete development.

Developed standardized timelines and procedures for yearly staff/board/committee compliance requirements, ensuring on-time completion.

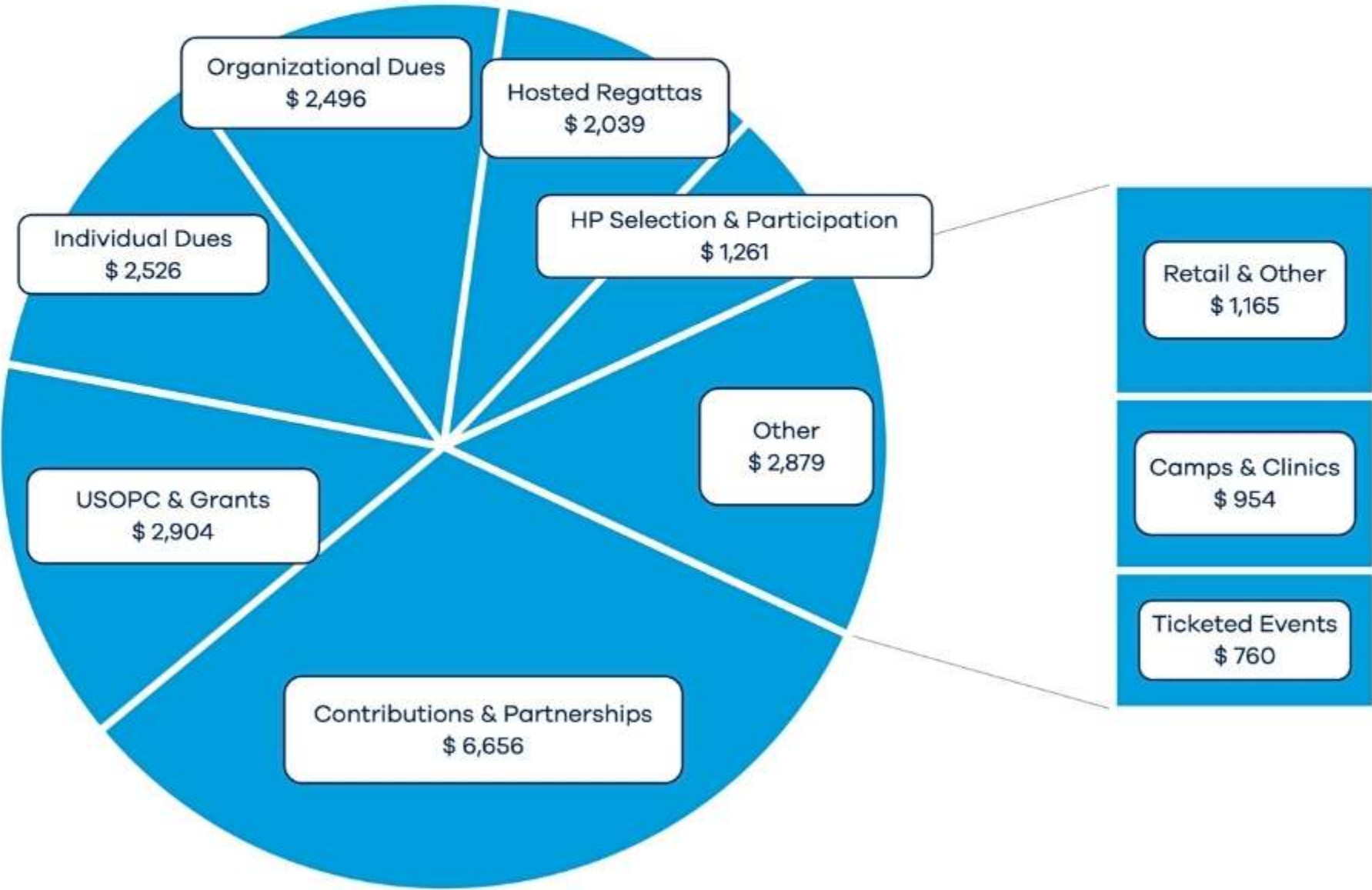
Beta-tested a company-wide AI platform to launch staff-wide in 2026, allowing use of AI tools to improve efficiency while maintaining secure data.

Reduced costs through transitioning to a new PEO platform to better serve staff and to improve benefits.

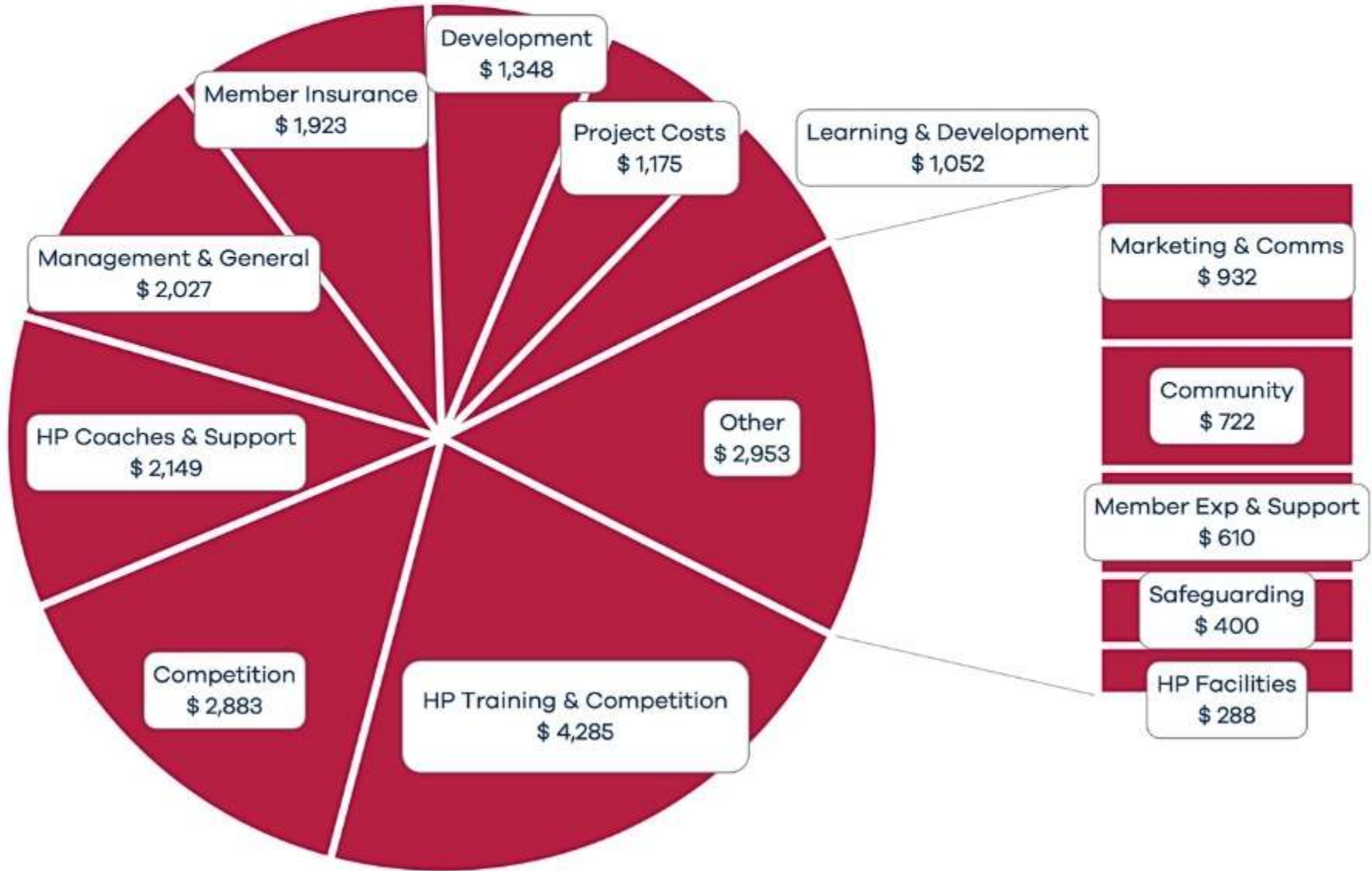


2025 REVENUE & EXPENSES BY CATEGORY

FINANCIAL TRENDS

OPERATING REVENUES, EXPENSES AND SURPLUS/(DEFICIT)*



We closed 2025 in a strong financial position, with an operating surplus of approximately **\$968k**. Total revenue reached **\$20.8M**, supported by generous contributions, continued grant funding, growing membership participation, in-kind support, and one-time revenue disbursements. Expenses totaled **\$19.8M** as we continued to invest in program delivery, athlete support, community engagement, and staff development.

A meaningful portion of this year's surplus reflects items unique to 2025, including the Employee Retention Tax Credit and investment income. These one-time payouts, combined with operational efficiencies, strengthened our year-end position and provided a solid foundation as we move into 2026 and continue investing in our strategic priorities, member experience, and the advancement of the sport.

The Importance of an Operating Surplus

If USRowing experiences an operating surplus, we use that surplus to fund our strategic cash reserve. This cash reserve provides stability in times of uncertainty and makes us less vulnerable to fluctuating economic changes. Additionally, a cash reserve allows us to take advantage of new opportunities; this could be an investment in technology that improves the membership experience or growing coastal and indoor rowing through expanding support and competitions. Having this reserve allows us to offer new value-adding experiences and programming for our community.
