Role Overview

Key Responsibilities

Member Engagement & Representation

- Provide input on strategies, policies, and initiatives that relate to their role in the rowing community
- Serve as a primary liaison between USRowing and peers by proactively gathering feedback, concerns, and insights to bring member voices into national discussions
- Partner with the NGB to co-design forums, resources, and learning opportunities within their specific peer group

Trust & Transparency

- Support USRowing in communicating decisions, initiatives, and changes with clarity and openness
- Foster understanding of governance processes, policies, and strategic directions

Help Elevate the Rowing Community

- Identify emerging trends and share best practices to elevate the sport and athlete experience across all levels of the sport
- o Fully understand USRowing's offerings to share with membership
- o Help shape and sustain a safety-oriented, positive, and inclusive culture

Expectations:

- Act ethically and transparently
- Participate actively in meetings
- Foster respectful, inclusive dialogue
- Stay informed on USRowing developments



Composition of the Collectives:

- Number of members in each group may vary, selected by nomination
- Diverse in geography, gender, race/ethnicity, and experience
- USRowing-appointed chair

Time Commitment:

- Quarterly meetings (virtual/in-person)
- Occasional additional work (1–2 hours/month)

Desired Qualifications:

- USRowing membership in good standing
- Demonstrated leadership in a rowing-related organization
- Active or recently active in relevant stakeholder group beyond their own organization (within a USRowing member organization in the last 2 years)
- Strategic thinker and strong communicator
- Demonstrated commitment to the growth of rowing and athlete success on and off the water
- Proven collaborator with a track record of building trust across stakeholders
- Commitment to growth, transparency, and inclusivity

Various Leadership Groups

Collegiate Rowing Leadership Group:

• **Seeking:** Collegiate coaches and directors from all divisions, sizes, and categories of collegiate rowing invested in working with USRowing to serve as a leader and ultimately provide more/better experiences for coaches and student-athletes

• Example Initiatives

- Surface unique challenges that collegiate programs face in the short and longterm
- Represent the collegiate space and provide insight and feedback on current and future policies, initiatives, and membership options
- Voice feedback on necessary platform improvements across the USRowing member portal and other SaaS platforms as it relates to the collegiate space

Masters Working Group:

- Note: This is an existing group that seeks to grow. The Working Group supports all
 rowers over the age of 21 with a goal of fostering a vibrant, inclusive national Masters
 rowing community that celebrates lifelong fitness, camaraderie, and personal
 growth through the shared joy of rowing
- **Seeking:** 2 additional members who are passionate about Masters rowing and the unique nature of rowing to be sport for life

Example Initiatives

- Determine the best ways to reach and retain Masters rowers
- Represent the Masters voice as it relates to regattas, social opportunities, and other benefits
- o Provide input on policies, rules, and initiatives related to Masters



Regatta Directors Leadership Group

• **Seeking:** Leaders who run USRowing sanctioned regattas at all levels of the sport with a desire to serve as a partner to build stronger, safer, regattas that represent the best rowing has to offer

• Example initiatives:

- o Advise on roll-out of new policies or initiatives related to regattas
- Provide input on the sanctioning application and approval process both systematically and functionally
- Serve as a liaison to other regatta organizers, facilitating communication or questions to USRowing as needed
- Provide input on how USRowing can best support sanctioned regattas to grow participation and membership experience

Scholastic Leadership Group

 Seeking: Leaders from scholastic rowing programs interested in collaborating with USRowing to provide better experiences for coaches, student-athletes, and administrators involved in this category of rowing

• Example initiatives:

- Advise on roll-out of new policies or initiatives within the scholastic rowing community, including coach education and development, compliance, and regattas,
- Manage stakeholder list for idea-sharing and networking
- Advise USRowing on how we can best support Scholastic Programs



Team Leader Leadership Group

• **Seeking:** Club administrators and directors from organizations of all sizes and locations with a desire to serve as a changemaker, amplify opportunities for the rowing community, and help develop, promote, and retain coaches

• Example initiatives:

- Voice feedback on necessary platform improvements across the USRowing member portal and other SaaS platforms
- Provide feedback on the user experience and user interface of new features as a community representative platform tester
- Assist in identifying critical topics within the rowing community for USRowing to improve
- Promote and help support mentorship programs and talent identification among coaches
- Provide input on curricula for coaching conferences, coaching certifications and ongoing educational opportunities

Nomination Process

Call for Nominations

- Nominations are open NOW (July 31, 2025) through August 31, 2025
- Nominations will open annually (or as needed) and remain open for one month
- USRowing will announce the nomination period through its official communication channels

How to Nominate

- Nominees must be an active USRowing member
- Individuals must self-nominate using this Jotform
- *If you think someone is great for this role, let them know and encourage them to nominate themselves!

Review & Vetting

- Select USRowing staff will review the nomination forms. Forms due by August 31
- Final selections will be made by September 29th

Appointment & Onboarding

 Newly selected group members will receive a formal appointment letter and be onboarded accordingly
