Women's Sweep Coach — 2026 U19 National Team Selection Camp

Role Overview

The Women's Sweep Coach will be responsible for the technical, tactical, and cultural leadership of women's sweep athletes during the 2026 U19 Selection Camp. Working closely with the U19 Head Coach and Pathways staff, this role supports athlete identification, development, and preparation for potential selection to the 2026 World Rowing Under 19 Championships.

Timeline & Commitment

- **June–early August 2026** (Selection Camp through World Championships)
- Participation in **pre-camp planning meetings via Zoom** in the months leading into camp
- On-site commitment required for the duration of Selection Camp and Worlds (if selected to travel)

Key Responsibilities

- Lead daily on-water and land-based training for women's sweep boats (4+/8+)
- Support athlete evaluation and selection decisions in collaboration with the Head Coach
- Develop technical models consistent with USRowing Pathways principles
- Foster a high-performance, athlete-centered, and inclusive team culture
- Collaborate with other coaches to ensure alignment across disciplines
- Communicate clearly with athletes regarding expectations, feedback, and development goals
- Support off-water programming, including education sessions and team meetings
- Uphold all USRowing policies, including SafeSport and athlete welfare standards

Compensation

- **\$4,000–\$6,000**, commensurate with experience and role responsibilities

Preferred Qualifications

- Demonstrated experience coaching junior or U19-aged athletes in sweep rowing
- Strong technical knowledge and ability to communicate effectively with developing athletes

Women's Sculling Coach — 2026 U19 National Team Selection Camp

Role Overview

The Women's Sculling Coach will lead the technical and developmental direction of women's sculling athletes at the 2026 U19 Selection Camp. This role plays a critical part in advancing small-boat skills, confidence, and performance within the Pathways pipeline.

Timeline & Commitment

- **June–early August 2026**
- Participation in **pre-camp planning and alignment meetings via Zoom**
- On-site presence required for Selection Camp and World Championships (if selected to travel)

Key Responsibilities

- Lead on-water sculling sessions (1x/2x/4x as applicable)
- Develop technical proficiency and boat-moving effectiveness in sculling shells
- Evaluate athletes' readiness for international competition in collaboration with the Head Coach
- Provide clear, constructive feedback to support athlete growth
- Align training and selection processes with USRowing Pathways standards
- Collaborate closely with sweep coaches and support staff
- Contribute to athlete education sessions and team culture initiatives
- Ensure adherence to USRowing policies and athlete-safety standards

Compensation

- Extensive experience coaching junior scullers and small-boat development

Team Manager — 2026 U19 National Team Selection Camp

Role Overview

The Team Manager supports the operational, logistical, and athlete-services needs of the 2026 U19 Selection Camp. This role is essential to creating a professional, organized, and athlete-centered environment that allows coaches and athletes to focus on performance and development.

Timeline & Commitment

- **June–early August 2026**
- Participation in **pre-camp coordination meetings via Zoom**
- On-site presence required throughout Selection Camp and World Championships

Key Responsibilities

- Oversee daily camp logistics, schedules, and athlete check-ins
- Serve as a primary point of contact for athletes, parents, and staff on non-coaching matters
- Coordinate travel, housing, meals, and equipment logistics (as applicable)
- Support communication between coaches, USRowing staff, and athletes
- Assist with accreditation, uniforms, and administrative documentation
- Uphold USRowing SafeSport, conduct, and safeguarding standards
- Provide general athlete support and problem-solving throughout camp

Compensation

- **\$4,000–\$6,000**, commensurate with experience and scope of responsibilities

Preferred Qualifications

- Prior experience as a team manager or administrator in rowing or sport
- Strong organizational and communication skills
- Ability to manage competing priorities in a fast-paced environment

Coach Intern (Non-Worlds Traveling) — 2026 U19 Selection Camp

Role Overview

The Coach Intern position is a **developmental, non-Worlds traveling role** designed for emerging coaches seeking exposure to a national team selection environment. The intern will support on-water and off-water activities while learning from experienced Pathways and U19 staff.

Timeline & Commitment

- **June–July 2026** (Selection Camp only)
- Participation in **pre-camp orientation meetings via Zoom**
- On-site presence required for the duration of Selection Camp

Key Responsibilities

- Assist coaches during on-water training sessions
- Support athlete monitoring, equipment handling, and practice setup
- Observe selection processes and athlete evaluations
- Participate in staff meetings and educational sessions
- Assist with video review, data collection, or technical support as needed
- Uphold USRowing values, professionalism, and athlete-safety standards

Compensation

- **\$2,500-\$4,000**, commensurate with experience and role scope

Preferred Qualifications

- Early-career coach or graduate student with interest in high-performance rowing
 - Experience coaching junior, scholastic, or club athletes
