Native American Heritage Month, also known as American Indian or Alaska Native Heritage Month, is observed to honor and celebrate the culture, traditions, and achievements of Native and Indigenous people and their descendants in the United States. Native American spirituality, both traditionally and today, emphasizes gratitude for creation, care for the environment, and recognition of the human need for communion with nature and others.

Currently, 574 independent sovereign nations have treaties with the U.S. It is important to note that these tribal nations are ethnically, culturally, and linguistically diverse.

WAYS TO CELEBRATE

At USRowing, we encourage our community members and leaders across the country to:

Acknowledgment by itself is a small gesture, an optical act of allyship. It becomes meaningful when coupled with an authentic relationship and informed action.
